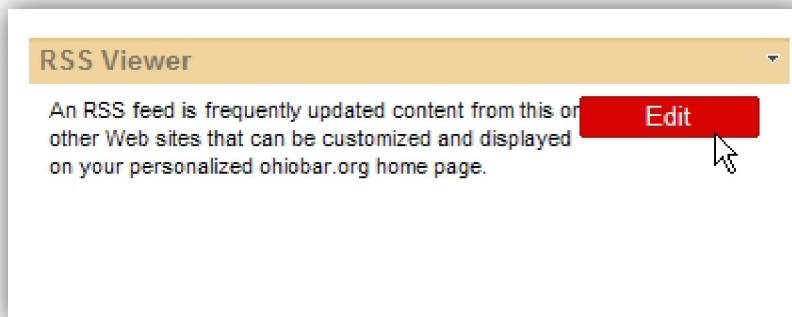


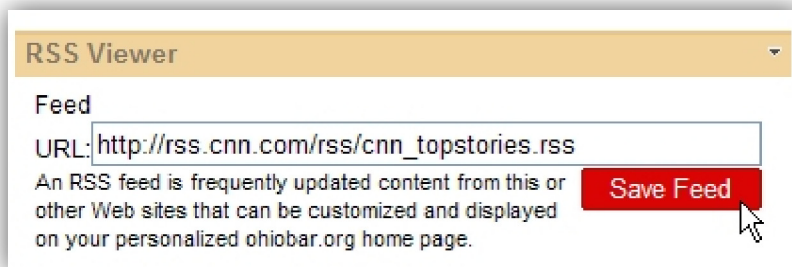
How to: Use RSS feeds/viewer

RSS feeds are frequently updated streams of information embedded on one Web page from another source site. On the OSBA Web site, you can customize the RSS viewer to show headlines from any compatible site on the Internet, as well as the latest from OSBA publications.

1. Sign in to the OSBA Web site. (See **How to: Log in to the OSBA Web site.**)
2. Click on the “Edit” button under RSS Viewer on the bottom-left side of the home page.



3. Enter the URL (for example, http://rss.cnn.com/rss/cnn_topstories.rss) of the feed you want to display into the field labeled “Feed URL.”



4. You can also import RSS feeds from other Web sites by finding an RSS link on the site, then copying and pasting the provided URL into the field labeled “Feed URL.”
5. Click the “Save Feed” button.

6. Click on a headline to view the article on your RSS Viewer.
